Plane Wall a unique collaborative art installation by twin brothers. It aims to harbour, provoke and express the passionate, imaginative, creative and obsessive tides within us. Visitors are invited to: spend time; to wonder; to question; and to reflect. The myriad of shapes, unexpected objects, shadows and patterns embrace the visual experience. The accompanying sound-track adds its extra immersive quality.

It is literally 'walls of planes' which offer gentle, visible pathways to the 'temporary' sitting rooms and a kaleidoscopic view to the past. Suspended model aircraft are ingeniously intertwined with family memorabilia. They quietly occupy the environment enhanced with vintage furniture and mirrors, creating a private, moving and nostalgic atmosphere.

The aircraft were donated by John in response to minimizing his surroundings. I accepted his collection trusting our inventive, furtive and collective minds. The familiar family adage 'they'll be useful one day' re-orientate their function and purpose, thus fuelling our creative desires.

The aircraft span from years of a constant, systematic assembly and finishing. The process inextricably fulfils both John's life-long passion and interest, and methods of coping with the stresses of his O.C.D and A.S.D traits.

During our early 70s childhood, the assembly of model kits extended our innate dexterous skills and now unites us creatively.

Previously, visitors shared their attuned stories from family and friends and recalled lives tainted, touched and transformed by the presence and passing of winged machines. The Trustees meet for an evening once a month in East Finchley to talk about current issues, other ways of helping local animal and how to raise funds for the Branch to help local animals in need.

About RSPCA Finchley, Golders Green, Hendon & District Branch

The main activity of the Branch is, supporting the Inspectorate by rescuing and finding new homes for companion animals who for a variety of reasons, are either homeless or cannot stay with their present owner. The branch also help public through their subsidised clinic in East Finchley. We cover an area ranging from Cricklewood in the South to Stanmore and Whetstone in the North, (Our cats can be rehomed to anywhere in the UK).

What are we looking for?

We are looking for people from all social and cultural backgrounds, all ages (over 18) and with a variety of experiences and skills to draw on, whether these have been formed through life or work situations.

These skills include the traditional type; management, legal, fundraising and financial, to help ensure we have a sound and robust business model and long term strategic development plan. However, we are also looking for people who are creative, innovative, who have experience of, or are part of the groups and communities we want to attract, who can bring new ideas, different experiences and fresh perspectives to the Board and to help put those ideas into action.

Branch Trustees need to be committed to the RSPCA's charitable objectives, so having a passion for animals is very helpful too.

Practical considerations

Before becoming a trustee of the Finchley, Golders Green, Hendon & District Branch, you must be a Member of the RSPCA for a minimum of 3 months before you can be co-opted in (please also state you wish to be a member of Finchley, Golders Green, Hendon & District Branch when you join).

You also need to have volunteered for our Branch for 3 months in order to gain the knowledge and skills of how our Branch works and what is required of a trustee.

Full help and support is provided. It is a very rewarding role as you will be helping a charity who rescues and helps local animals in need.

Reasonable expenses reimbursed.

- Own computer or secure access to one
- Will require references

- 3: Your details will be passed to one of our Trustees who will contact you to arrange a meeting
- 4: You will be sent a trustee Profile form to complete and invited to sit in on the first part of one of our meetings. You will be provided with lots of information to make a fully informed decision.
